



Exhibition Sanam Khatibi

Sanam Khatibi's works deal with animality, and our primal impulses and the core of her practice interrogates our relationship to power structures, specifically the duality of triumph and failure. The recurrent themes that often feature in her work question our relation to excess, loss of control, bestiality, domination and submission. She is also interested in the thin line that exists between fear and desire, and how closely they are interrelated.


Her subjects live on their impulses in alluring, exotic landscapes. They are ambiguous with their relationship to power, violence, sensuality

and each other. She plays with ambivalence to juxtapose dualities such as animal versus human, past versus present, and cruelty versus seduction. Wildlife and animals are an integral part of her practice, and her subjects are often depicted within the same plane as the flora and fauna.

Her work consists of paintings, embroideries, tapestries, and sculptures.

Belgian artist, lives and works in Brussels.

Lemon Drizzle

'Lemon drizzle" is the name of the solo exhibition with paintings and an artistic installation of the Belgian artist Sanam Khatibi (° Tehran). Khatibi's oeuvre is diverse. Her art is enigmatic.

The artist does not only make paintings large and small size. She also creates sculptures, embroidery, tapestries. Megalomaniac paintings on canvas are reminiscent of the iconography and compositions of Lucas Cranach the Elder, Jan Van Scorel, Frida Kahlo ...

In every artwork by Sanam Khatibi is emerging a literary force. Still lifes on panel, of a smaller size, derive their intimacy, sense of detail and picturesque power to 17th-century Baroque still lifes. The artist brings to each vanitas scene a wealth of visual material together.

Gesammtkunstwerk

Sanam Khatibi handles aspects of one spacious, artistic legacy that is part of the collective memory, in the visual language, design and the coloration of her works. All works of art in the exhibition form one 'Gesammtkunstwerk'. They tell a layered story. They belong inseparably together, in terms of content, scenographic and according to use of color. The artist uses in the paintings of Lemon Drizzle repeatedly a (light) green and yellow tonality.

Connecting the colors. They become in all their facets dissected artistically and emotionally.

From a humble attitude that graces her, one exhibition space is sufficient for Sanam Khatibi to her art and living world to reveal. She brings two large paintings there, a selection of still lifes and a handful of meticulous selected ceramics and other objects from her personal collection and from the collection of Musea Brugge together.

Now that the evening is no longer silent (2018) and Lemon Drizzle (2021) practice, due to their spaciousness dimensions and overwhelming figures, one conjuring power. Showcase the paintings – like grotesques – thin, almost transparent, naked female figures in a natural looking, opulent decor. They bathe sensually in color and light.

With a refined sense of detail, Sanam Khatibi pays tribute to those who have the power of just embrace nature and human violence also defy.

The composition of "Now that the evening is no longer silent "is reminiscent of the Landscape with Bathsheba from ca.1540–1545 by Jan van Scorel (Schoorl 1495 – Utrecht 1562). Just like Van Scorel, Khatibi carefully manipulates and calculates it perspective. She has a low point of view, places the Venus figures broadly drawn out the canvas. One of the female figures is flattering down in a panoramic landscape. Trees and shrub parties divide the composition and grant depth, create dynamism.

The monumental size of the two largeworks and the large-scale figures on this one Paintings, places the accompanying still lifes with often tiny objects and creatures not in the shadow. The smaller works come to a halt to the fluid mobility of man and nature on large-format works. Miniscule objects enjoy the subtle play of lightdark, will be in an undefined space posited. The meticulous lines and intense color setting make them recognizable as silent witnesses to the silent vanita scene. Similar small objects are also part of the great paintings. Playing in the still lifes they take on the role of soloists. The objects on the still lifes tell the story of the great works in close up. They have been torn from their natural surroundings. They become symbols, emblemata. The scenes have a calming effect. They intoxicate.

Magic, mythology and mysticism

"Lemon drizzle" is more than an exhibition. The expo in capsule form offers a place to experience art. Khatibi, the artwork and the visitors are part of a magical stage performance. Khatibi is protagonist. Her universe appeals to the imagination. Khatibi chooses, in every work of art, for a complex iconography. In the paintings and installation brings the artist man and animal, the inevitable death and death, transience and life, feelings of defense and resignation, power and impotence, violence and destruction, all in one fantastic, mysterious world. It seem mythological scenes. Move at the same time the living beings as figures in mystical tableaux vivants with an apocalyptic character. They elicit wonder. They call out admiration. The stories with human rituals feel terrifyingly real. Artist and art invite reflect.

Groeningemuseum

Sanam Khatibi's oeuvre adds an extra dimension to the Groeninge collection that spans a period of more than 500 years. The museum acts as a muse here, as well as "encyclopedia". Khatibi refers in her after all, regularly work for artists, themes and art styles from different periods and pranks, leaving the masterpieces out of it Groeningemuseum will become even more valuable.

In this way, the collection does not only show that it is an inexhaustible source for (contemporary) artists, but they also like frame of reference.










Mind the Artist
